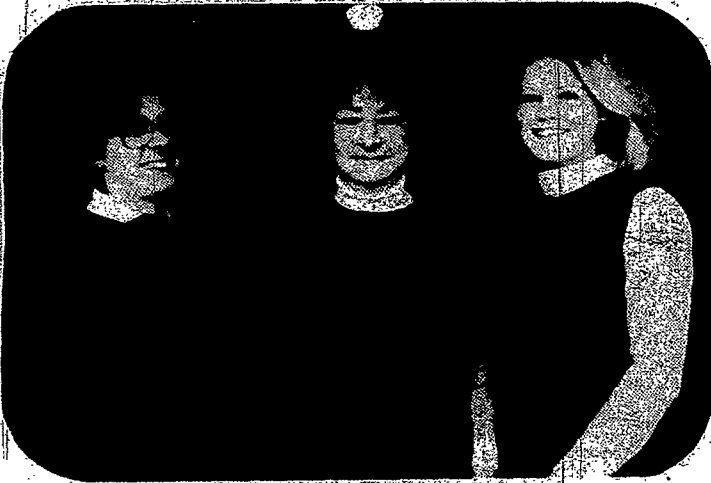

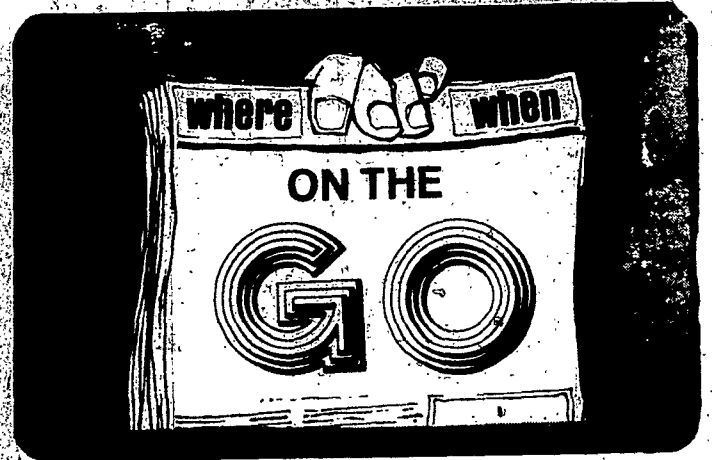
There were 74 entries submitted to the contest and the selected five will appear in the Spring issue of the Spectrum. The three top winners also received gift certificates from McDonald's.
