Deaths

Fr. Bede, OCSO

Father Bede Czarny, one of the founders of the Abbey of the Genesee, died Feb. 4, 1978, after a two-month illness. He was 76 years-old and had been a priest in the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance for 28 years.

A number of priests from this diocese and elsewhere concelebrated the Mass of Christian Burial with the monks at the Abbey church on Monday afternoon, Feb. 6.

Father Bede had been novice master, retreat master and prior in the course of his 26 years at Genesee. In recent years, until his illness, he served as porter and confessor to his fellows and to many priests and people of the area.

After several years as a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, he joined the Trappists at Gethsemane, in Kentucky, and came to Piffard in 1951.
