A Christmas Card . . . From the Pope!

"It's really a miracle," says Helen Ogradowski of the Christmas card she received recently from Pope Paul VI.

"I was shocked when I opened it. I started crying and couldn't stop. I called my boss, and he started crying, too.

Helen describes her recent acquisition not as a solo effort but rather as a collaboration among 11 friends, all members of a Bible-sharing group.

Bernie Pawlowski, manager of the Waldert Opticians in Irondequoit, where Helen works, and leader of the group of "born again" Christians, had 1,000 cards printed which read: "Happy Birthday Jesus," and included verses from Scripture. Then the cards were sent out to their friends, area clergy, and the Pope.

Mrs. Ogradowski's unexpected reply arrived Feb. 1 from the Vatican via Washington, D.C., and included a letter from the Holy Father's Assessor, Msgr. G. Coppa.

The letter states:

"The Holy Father was pleased to receive the prayerful good wishes so kindly sent to him for Christmas and the New

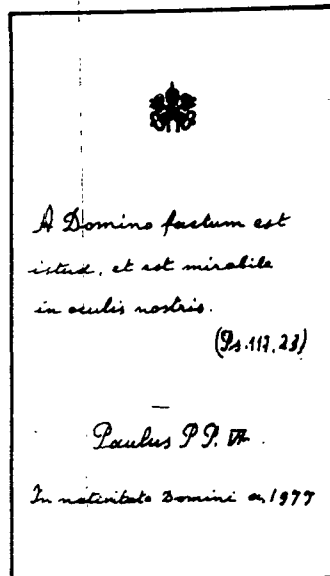
Workshop On Lobbying
