## On Behalf of the World's Poor

A second collection is in the works for this Sunday, March 5, traditionally the time when Catholic Relief Services makes its annually fruitful appeal for funds. Every dollar given in the parishes enables the agency to tap other sources for \$33 additional dollars, to support a \$240 million program. CRS follows quick, emergency relief to disaster victims in all quarters of the globe with rebuilding projects. In progress at any given time, the agency says, are 1,500 self-help operations involving all

employable needy persons in the area — such undertakings as road building, well digging, land reclamation, farm improvement and setting up child nutrition centers and cooperatives.

Some of the resources that enhance the annual CRS collection are listed in its report as provided by national and international government agencies and others; foundations, corporations and religious congregations.

CRS is a means of serving

the poor "in keeping with Catholic social doctrine," the report states. The agency stresses that it works with various other social

agencies, but not through foreign governments, and administers its programs for less than four per-cent of its total expenditures.
