

St. Anthony's To Receive Aid

St. Anthony of Padua Church, 60 Lorimer St., Rochester, received a "breath of fresh air" recently from an unexpected source.

Father Albert DePascale, pastor, said that a dinner, featuring nationally known restaurateur Giovanna D'Agostino (known as Mama D) will be given by Sibley's Department Store for the benefit of the parish.

Father DePascale explained that the benefit dinner came through the work of the Foster Friends of St. Anthony's, a committee of parishioners, former parishioners, alumni and friends dedicated to helping the parish "liquidate its mortgage".

He said that while the committee was in the process of planning a benefit ball, a member was asked by Sibley's to round up hostesses for the Mama D dinner. The invitation was accepted, with the provision that the dinner be sponsored by the Foster Friends for the benefit of St. Anthony's.
