sort is going on in St. Bridget's Parish on the east side of Rochester. The Bishop Sheen Housing Foundation, established ten years ago, gives nointerest loans to people to be used as down payments on purchasing a home. Many times the poor cannot amass the money needed for a down payment and this no-interest loan enables them to move out of apartments and into their own homes. Bishop Sheen Housing Foundation has helped approximately 70 families over the five year period.

Social Change — Bishop Hogan issued a pastoral letter on the subject of housing in the City of Rochester. We has taken advantage of a Federal Program and built a high-rise for older persons. Father Marvin of St. Ambrose Parish has received a HUD Grant to explore the possibility of transforming his convent into communal living situations for older people. The Office of Human Development is in touch with older persons living in high-rise apartments attempting to get them into an organization which can speak to management concerning conditions and prices.

The Bishop Sheen Housing Foundation and the Office of Human Development would back legislation calling for the availability of mortgage money from the banks and in general trying to begin again the housing programs that were slowed on the national level during the Nixon Administration. Further, the Bishop Sheen Housing Foundation will fund community housing groups who may either rehabilitate or provide new housing in the community. One project of this sort renovates houses in the Corning Area using the money loaned by the foundation to purchase the materials and then sells them at cost to families who purchase them as their homes.
