1. Application for dispensation from mixed religion or disparity of worship.

2. a. Application for permission to witness the marriage outside a Catholic Church (if necessary), or

b. Application for dispensation from canonical form (if necessary).

Section IX is considered extra synodal, legislation — all exceptions to the procedures in Section IX must be approved by the Ordinary.

ATTITUDINAL QUESTIONNAIRE FOR PRE-MARITAL INVESTIGATION
