Duo-pianists Plan Sunday Concert

Sister Kathleen Kircher, coordinator of the diocesan Ministry to Separated, Divorced and Remarried Catholics, has been named to the advisory board of the North American Conference of Separated, Divorced and/or remarried Catholics. The board will first convene in July, under the chairmanship of Father James J. Young, CSP.

Rosa Casanova and Violeta de la Mata, internationally known duo-pianists, will give a concert here on Sunday, May 7, the 150th anniversary of the death of Franz Schubert. They have dedicated the program to his memory and will perform, among other things, the Schubert Fantasy in F Minor. The concert will begin at 7 p.m. at the Hochstein School, 50 N. Plymouth.

The two Puerto Rican pianists studied at the New England Conservatory in Boston and with Dr. Josef Dichler in Vienna. They have been touring Europe, the United States and Puerto Rico for the past 12 years. Their appearance here is sponsored by the Puerto Rican Arts and Cultural Center.
