In the Church, the month of May is dedicated to Mary, Mother of the World. In the United States, May, by proclamation, is Senior Citizens' Month. Drawing the strands together, some pastoral assistants in city parishes are preparing a celebration—a tribute to Mary by senior citizens.

They have chartered buses to carry their guests tomorrow afternoon on visits to churches particularly associated with Mary. Scripture passages will lead to reflections on her life, during stops at Our Lady of Good Counsel and Immaculate Conception. The excursion will begin at noon with prayer at St. Anne's on Mt. Hope Avenue, followed by a luncheon prepared by the seniors of the parish. It will end with a visit to shut-ins at the Mercy Motherhouse on Blossom Road, where Benediction will be celebrated. Tea will be served.

The afternoon's events will be "rather contemporary, but with some very traditional elements," Sister Barbara

Moore of St. Monica's said. "We may include a brief history of each parish and its title." The guest list includes parishioners from St. Augustine's and Ss. Peter and Paul.

"Eighty have signed up already, so perhaps we'll have 100," Sister Barbara noted a week ago. "It won't cost them any money, because we have got donations to cover all expenses."
