To Our Golden Jubilarians

Two diocesan priests on June 9 observe a total of 100 years of priestly service to the Church. They are Father Edward H. Hartmann and Father Charles R. Reynolds.

Father Reynolds will begin his celebrations on Sunday, June 4, with a Mass of Thanksgiving at 12:15 p.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas Church in Leicester where he served 31 years as pastor.

Concelebrating with him will be Father Edwin R. Wedow, who succeeded Father Reynolds as pastor,

and Father Walter L. Wainwright, the present pastor.

A public reception will be held in St. Thomas Aquinas Hall from 3 to 5 p.m. on that day. On Thursday, June 8, Father Reynolds and his classmate, Father Hartmann, will concelebrate an anniversary Mass with Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey at the chapel of St. Ann's Home.


Father Hartmann's parish celebration will start with an anniversary Mass at noon on

Sunday, June 11, with Auxiliary Bishop Hickey as principal concelebrant, in St. Mary of the Assumption Church, where he served as pastor for more than 31 years. Also concelebrating will be Msgr. Gerard C. Krieg, the present pastor.

A public reception will be held in the parish center from 7 to 10 p.m. that day.


Both Father Reynolds and Father Hartmann were ordained on June 9, 1928 at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Rochester. Father Hartmann

served at Sacred Heart Church (now the Cathedral), St. Patrick's in Elmira, St. Patrick's in Owego, and St. Monica's in Rochester before he was named pastor of St. Mary's in 1941. Father Hartmann retired in 1973 and continued to live among the people he had served until poor health resulted in his residence at The Heritage. Father Reynolds served at Corpus Christi Church in Rochester and for several years was secretary to Bishop John F. O'Hern. He was named to the triple pastorate of St. Thomas, St. Lucy in

On Your 40th

Of the seven diocesan priests who claim kinship with the priestly ordination class of 1938, four are celebrating this month their 40th anniversary.

The other three are Father Edward Lintz, who was ordained March 27, 1938; Msgr. Richard Burns, who was ordained Dec. 8, 1937; and Msgr. Joseph J. Sullivan, who was ordained Sept. 24, 1938.

The four are:

Father Valentine A. Jankowiak, pastor of St. Cecilia's Church in Elmira. Father Jankowiak was ordained in Poznan, Poland on June 11, 1938. The parish will celebrate his anniversary with a Mass 11:30 a.m. on June 11, to be followed by a dinner at 1 p.m. His nephew, Father Joseph Jankowiak will preach the homily. The elder Father Jankowiak has been pastor of St. Cecilia's since 1974. He has previously served at St. Casimir's in Elmira, St. Francis DeSales in Geneva, St. Cecilia's in Irondequoit and St. Margaret Mary in Apalachin.

Father Francis Vogt,

pastor of St. Anne's Church in Palmyra, will observe his anniversary quietly. He was ordained in Rochester on June 11, 1938. He has served at St. Anthony's in Elmira, St. Francis of Assisi in Rochester, Holy Family in Rochester, St. Salome's in Rochester and at St. Bridget's in Rochester, where he was named pastor. He has also served as chaplain in the Army Reserve.

Father Robert Kress, pastor of St. Joseph's Church in Rush, will celebrate with a Mass at 4 p.m. on June 11, followed by a reception. Father Kress was ordained in Rochester on June 11, and has served at Immaculate Conception in Ithaca, Ss. Peter and Paul's in Rochester, St. Mary's in Auburn, St. John the Evangelist in Rochester, and as pastor to St. Mary's in Rexville/St. Joachim's in Canisteo, and St. Michael's in Port Byron.

Msgr. Leslie G. Whalen, pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Brighton for the past 20 years, celebrates the double anniversary with a Mass

concelebrated with Bishop Joseph L. Hogan at 5:30 p.m. on June 3, followed by a dinner in the parish hall. On June 4, the parish will fete him with a champagne and punch party during the afternoon. Msgr. Whalen was ordained on June 11, and has served at St. Mary's in Auburn, Ss. Peter and Paul in Elmira and St. Mary's in Rochester. He also served for three years in the United States Navy.

To Msgr. Schwab

Two celebrations will mark the 60th anniversary of Msgr. Leo G. Schwab. The first will take place on his ordination date, June 8; the day before his 84th birthday; the second on June 11.

On Thursday, June 8, Bishop Joseph L. Hogan will concelebrate Mass with the jubilarian at 5:30 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes

Church, which Msgr. Schwab founded in 1940 and presided over for 29 years. A dinner will follow at the Holiday Inn.

Msgr. Schwab will offer another Mass of Thanksgiving at his old parish on the following Sunday at 12:15 p.m.

He retired in 1969, but serves as chaplain at the

Dominican Monastery of Mary the Queen in Elmira. Fifty-four of his 60 years in the priesthood have been spent in that city. After a brief initial assignment at Immaculate Conception in Rochester, he was sent to St. Patrick's Elmira 1918-1934. For the next six years, he was at St. Thomas Leicester, until his appointment to Lourdes. He lives these days at St. John the Baptist.

An enormous celebration took place last week which drew more than 200 priests from around the diocese and the three bishops. The occasion was a celebration of priestly service, hosted by the ordination class of 1953, which this month notes its 25th jubilee.

The nine members of that class are Father Robert J. Donovan, Father Bernard Dollen, Father Frederick Eisemann, Father William Hickey, Msgr. Gerard Krieg, Father Leo Mans, Father Paul Schnacky, Father Edwin R. Wedow, and Father Robert G. Smith.

In addition to that celebration, the individual priests are noting their anniversaries in their parishes.

Father Donovan, pastor of St. John's in Newark Valley/St. Francis in Catatonk, will celebrate a jubilee Mass on June 4 at 2:30 p.m. A reception will follow the Mass, from 4 to 6 p.m. in the Friendly Village Community Center. A family dinner will close out the celebration.

Father Donovan has served at St. Patrick's in Elmira, St. Thomas the Apostle in Irondequoit, St. Mary's in Canandaigua, Holy Family in Auburn, and St. Mary of the Lake in Watkins Glen.

Father Dollen, pastor of St. Andrew's Church in Rochester, which was the site for the celebrations last week, was regaled with a play by the school children

on May 25, and will celebrate an anniversary Mass on June 4. The parish will fete him with a party on June 6.

Father Dollen has served at Holy Rosary in Rochester, St. Francis Xavier in Rochester, St. Salome's in Rochester, and Holy Ghost in Coldwater.

Father Eisemann, pastor of Holy Family in Rochester, will note his anniversary with a reception at a special concert by the Songsters on June 10. The following day he will celebrate an anniversary Mass at noon.

Father Eisemann has served at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, St. Alphonsus in Auburn, St. Ann's in Hornell and St. Peter and Paul in
