ME, Festival Planned For Spanish

Two big events are on tap for the diocesan Spanish-speaking community.

First, a marriage encounter weekend in Spanish is scheduled June 9 to 11 at Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua.

Beginning Friday, June 16, the annual St. John the Baptist Festival weekend will take place.

The Spanish Apostolate has developed the marriage encounter weekend for Spanish couples, in conjunction with the Office of Family Life.

The St. John the Baptist festival, sponsored by the diocesan Spanish Council, honors the patron saint of Puerto Rico. A dance, crowning of the queen are scheduled Friday night, June 16. The next day, Father Edward Golden will

celebrate Mass at 10 a.m. at St. Francis Xavier, 316 Bay St. with homily by Father Robert Ritz.

Then at noon Saturday, a parade will begin at the church and a carnival will follow until 8 p.m. All events are scheduled at the church.

Nuncio In Poland

Warsaw (RNS) — Archbishop Luigi Poggi, head of the Vatican's delegation for a "permanent working contact" with the Polish government arrived here May 23 to continue talks on "normalization" of relations between the Church and the Polish state.

Archbishop Poggi, who holds the title of Apostolic Nuncio with Special Portfolio, visited Warsaw in March and May of last year for a resumption of church-state talks. He made his first visit to Poland for meetings with government officials in 1975. A second visit was made in 1976.

St. Stanislaus to Fete Father Alexander Stec

There will be a bittersweet touch to the celebrations for Father Alexander J. Stec's 45th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood on Sunday, June 11.

Father Stec later this month will retire from the pastorate of St. Stanislaus Parish, a post he has held for the past 19 years.

Father Henry Adamski, pastor of Elmira's St. Casimir's Parish, will join

Father Stec at a 4 p.m. Mass of Thanksgiving and will preach at that Mass.

A reception will be held in the parish auditorium immediately following the Mass.

Father Stec was named pastor of St. Stanislaus in 1959. Prior to that time he had served as administrator and then as pastor of St. John's in Newark Valley/St. Francis in Catonk, "God's

country," as he puts it. He served those posts for a total of 21 years.

Father Stec has also served the parishes of St. Michael's in Newark and Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Rochester.

At the bidding of Archbishop (later Cardinal) Edward Mooney, Father Stec pursued advanced studies at the University of Cracow in Poland. Father Stec also is the recipient of a reproduction of the famed painting of Our Lady of Czestochowa, the national patroness of Poland, from the eminent primate of Poland, Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński.

Father Stec attended St. Bridget's School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.
