

# Prayer Center Slates Special Summer Events

A special series of Wednesday evening prayer experiences has been slated this summer at the Prayer Center at 428 Mt. Vernon Ave.

Among those events are an Evening of Dance/prayer, led by Sister Mary Kay Ryan, SSJ, on July 19 from 7 to 10 p.m.; and an Evening of Prayer/reflection and Eucharist, led by Msgr. William Shannon on July 12 from 7 to 9:30 p.m.

Eucharist will be celebrated by Father Edward Golden on July 5 at 7:30 p.m., and by Father Joseph Bestler on July 26 at 7:30 p.m. An Evening of Dance/prayer with Eucharist is slated for Aug. 2 at 7 p.m.

In addition to these special events the Prayer Center and

its grounds are available for leisure/prayer during the summer months for both individuals and groups.

The center, which is staffed by Sisters of St. Joseph, celebrates communal evening prayer at 5:30 p.m. (except for Tuesdays and Thursdays) and communal night prayer at 9 p.m. (except for Wednesdays).

During July, Eucharist will be celebrated on Sundays (except for the first Sunday) at 9 a.m.; on Monday and Friday at 8 a.m.; and on Tuesday and Thursday at 4:30 p.m.

The center also regularly schedules private retreats, weekends of directed prayer and offers spiritual direction for individuals and groups.

Weekends of directed prayer, open to lay persons, priests and women religious, offer private prayer, individual direction, an atmosphere of silence and daily Eucharist.

### Mary Mulligan

Mary Donohue Mulligan, formerly of Seneca Parkway, died June 13, 1978, in Strong Memorial Hospital. She was the wife of Charles F. Mulligan and mother of two diocesan priests, Fathers John and Charles Mulligan.

The Mass of Christian Burial was offered last Friday in Sacred Heart Cathedral by her sons and Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, in concelebration with Auxiliary Bishops Dennis W. Hickey and John E. McCafferty and about 30 other priests. The other three Mulligan children read from the Scriptures.

Mrs. Mulligan was active in local Catholic women's groups for many years. Lately, she had lived at Canandaigua Lake and in Florida.

She was a former president of the Sacred Heart Rosary Guild, St. Monica's Guild and Our Lady's Circle. A graduate of the College of St. Rose in Albany, she served also as president of the local alumnae group. She was a member of Seton Branch 12 and 1970 chairman of the Seton Ball, annual money-raiser for St. Mary's Hospital.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Robert L. Burkwit (Mary) of Webster; sons Jeremiah and Thomas, both of New York City; a brother, Paul F. Donohue of Albany, and a sister, Claire Helen Touhey of Geneva; six grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

### Thomas Goodman

Thomas James Goodman Sr., a Rochester native who grew up in Blessed Sacrament Parish, died May 25, 1978, at Oxon Hill, Md. He had worked for the Federal Government in Washington, D.C., since 1935.

His sister Mary has been rectory secretary at Holy Ghost, Coldwater, for the past 30 years. Another sister was employed by Annunciation Parish years ago. She is Sister Clare Goodman of the Missionary Servants of the Most Blessed Trinity, now in Philadelphia.

Mr. Goodman was buried

in Maryland after a funeral Mass May 30 at St. Columba's, Oxon Hill.

He leaves his widow, Ruth, two sons and a daughter — Robert, Thomas Jr. and Margaret Hood; four grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

### Father Witucki

Blossburg, Pa. — The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Father John P. Witucki May 31, 1978, at St. Mary's Church.

Father Witucki died May 28 after a long illness. He was 68 years old and in the 42nd year of his priesthood. He was a graduate of Blossburg High School, St. Cyril and Methodius College at Orchard Lake, Mich., and St. Mary's Seminary in LaPorte, Texas, where he was ordained. He held pastorates in Marlin and Bremond, Texas, before his retirement five years ago. He was a former chaplain of the Knights of Columbus here and a member of the Eucharistic League of Texas.

Survivors are two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Frisk of Elmira Heights, N.Y. and Mrs. Francis J. Kelly of Hornell, N.Y.; also a nephew, Joseph G. Frisk, Elmira Heights.
