All in the Family

Reading: We Are Not Alone

On a recent cool evening I found the 10-year-old sprawled over one of the large blue chairs in the living room far from the noise of the television set.

And he had a book in his hand. This in itself was not so amazing as he has, from time to time, picked up a volume or two. But after a speedy perusal he would throw it aside and look for some other, more physical diversion.

On this occasion, however, he had already plowed through 60 pages of the mystery his sister had found for him at the library and appeared engrossed enough to finish it in one sitting.

"Best book I ever read," he explained without looking up.

I moved away, saying my hennas to myself, letting the joy of knowing that he was reading for no other reason than pure pleasure wash over me.

An early reader, he had delighted us all with his ability to decode the printed word in the first weeks of kindergarten. But as he approached it is a job and never as a treat, a fact much deplored in this house of reading freaks. We entreated, cajoled, harangued and even resorted to bribery (50 cents for each book completed no matter the

length) over the years. But all to no avail.

Now, it appeared, something had clicked. He had discovered what some adults never do - an other world at one's fingertips no matter what one's physical environment or limitations dictated.

I wanted to tell him what reading had meant to me over the years and what it could mean to him. I did not mean that he would never be lonely, for one can still feel the need for companionship, for sharing thoughts and ideas with another human being, no matter how absorbing or high the stack of reading material one has stock-piled.

It did not mean he would never be bored. Reading is not, and never will be, a substitute for doing. The thrill of seeing, hearing, experiencing something for oneself will always top reading another individual's version of it, no matter how stylishly it is written, how deep the author's insight, how clever his conclusion.

What reading would mean to him, however, is a continuing opportunity to learn, to expand, to escape, to fill the cracks and crannies of one's consciousness, to transport oneself, to indulge oneself in an instant.

But, best of all, it would mean the discovery that he is not alone in his thoughts, dreams, fears. Since the beginning of civilization man has had similar ideas, aspirations and worries and in recording them has reassured us that we are not walking uncharted ground.

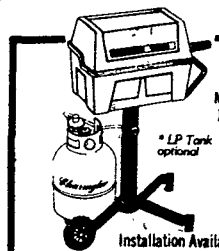
Marquette Alumni

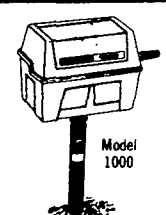

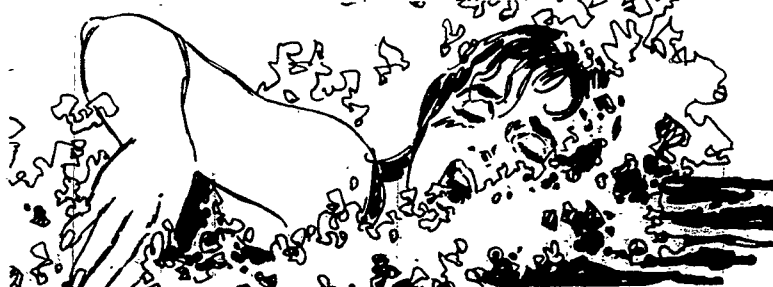
