A photographer and designer, and a professor at Rochester Institute of Technology, Benenate will be summoned to a Mass at Lourdes in the course of which he will be decorated with his silver medal. As a member of L'Hospitalite, he has already been titled "brancadier," and has been awarded a bronze medal for his service.

Up until 10 years ago, he says, he was "pretty much a typical Sunday Catholic." At that time, it was his wife's dying wish that he and she journey to the shrine.
