Stop Bloodshed, Demand Bishops

Salisbury (RNS) — Rhodesia's Roman Catholic bishops have called on the nation's people and the Smith government to discuss means of "bringing about an end to bloodshed and achieving enduring peace and justice in this country."

—Catholic authorities were successful in having Rhodesia cancel deportation of two missionaries, Father Dieter Scholtz, a German Jesuit who heads the episcopate's Justice and Peace Commission, and Father Martin O'Reagan, an Irish missionary.

Fathers in west Rhodesia, near the Zambia and Botswana borders.

Since 1976, 17 Catholic priests and nuns have been murdered in Rhodesia. Other Christian agencies have lost 15 missionaries.

The bishops offered their services "to do whatever we can to assist in the process of reconciliation."

They said they were "appalled at the continuance of bloodshed . . . which has led to the death of thousands of innocent people. We believe that our horror is shared by the mass of the people and shared by the political leaders."

Other developments:

—The Rhodesian government has deported 18 Catholic priests over the past 18 months, a report said.
