The Courier-Journal went to Beatrice Paul, president of the Rochester Board of Education for the answer.

"The cost continues to go up," she stated, "and our (city) portion of the cost goes up." She also indicated there has been talk this year of the state lowering or dropping altogether, the reimbursement.

She admitted having no argument with the busing service but emphasized, "As long as the funds are available for that service."

In summing the situation up, Sister Roberta Tierney, director of the Diocesan Education Division declared, "As of right now there will be no busing unless there is newly found money or legislative action."
