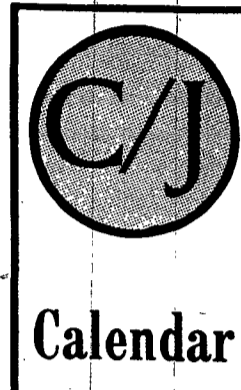

N.J. Campbell
Nicholas J. Campbell of Crestwood, N.Y., brother-in-law of Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey, died unexpectedly July 22, 1978. He was the husband of Katherine Hickey Campbell, formerly of Dansville.

The bishop offered the Mass of Christian Burial on July 25 in Annunciation Church, Crestwood. Rochester priests among the concelebrants were Fathers John Steger and James F. Slattery.

Mr. Campbell was a vice president of Exxon Corporation. He collapsed of a heart attack on a commuter train on his way home from work. Bishop Hickey had just stopped in to see his sister when police brought word of the death.

Survivors include a daughter, Mary C. Wynn; a sister and brother, Mrs.

Margaret C. Norton and Father Gerard J. Campbell, SJ, and a sister-in-law, Miss Helen S. Hickey.
