CHD Grants \$14,000 To 'Group 14621'

Group 14621, a community self-help organization geared to improve neighborhoods in the 14621 zip code section of Rochester, received a \$14,000 grant from the National Campaign for Human Development last Thursday.

The award, announced at 14621 headquarters in the Holy Redeemer School building, was the second grant given to 14621. Last year they received \$24,200.

In announcing the award Ernest B. Gutierrez Jr., a program officer for the National Campaign, remarked that his organization offered to give the group more money but 14621 officials declined. 14621 felt that they were able to raise the rest of the money needed on their own and that eventually they would become self-sustaining.

Gutierrez said that this action was "very praise worthy" and gave positive proof that 14621 "was on its way to self-sufficiency."

Ms. Kathy Romanoski, president of Group 14621, said that a major factor for the organization's success was the increased participation of people living in the area. The membership doubled this year with some 300 family and individual members, 35 neighborhood groups and several churches now active in 14621.

Group 14621 will use the money to continue their work in three general

areas — Youth Programs, Crime Prevention and Home Improvements.


This year they will begin a "Home Handyman" program complete with workshops on repairing damaged homes and a "tool bank" where people living in the area may borrow tools to make repairs.

In a written release Carole Lloyd, director of the Campaign for Human Development for the Rochester Diocese, said that Group 14621's efforts "are strengthening the neighborhood and giving a new sense of pride to people living in that part of the city."

Speaking on behalf of Bishop Joseph Hogan, Father Charles Mulligan,

director of Social Ministries, said that he was very impressed with 14621's growth and wished it continued success. Father Mulligan urged the area churches to continue to support 14621's efforts in the future.

In its eight-year history the National Campaign for Human Development has received some \$615,000 from the people of the Rochester Diocese. In that same time period the National Campaign has returned some \$539,000 for projects in the diocese. Lloyd attributes this "high return of funds" to "the excellent proposals generated in our diocese. It is also indicative of the expertise of diocesan people serving on local Campaign task forces and on the Campaign Board," she said.
