

# Turin Shroud Shown

**Turin (RNS)**—More than 160,000 pilgrims flocked here to view the Shroud of Turin during the first three days of the public exhibition of the linen sheet venerated by many as the actual burial shroud of Jesus Christ.

The 14-foot-3-inch cloth, which bears the negative image of man who appears to have been crucified, whipped, stabbed in the chest, and crowned with thorns, went on public display in the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist on Aug. 27.

Among the first visitors to the exhibition were Cardinals Terence J. Cooke of New York and Timothy Manning of Los Angeles, who had been in Rome for the conclave to elect Pope John Paul.

The exhibition will last until Oct. 8.

Archbishop Anastasio A. Ballestrero of Turin has given permission to an American scientific team to conduct tests on the shroud in an attempt to determine among other things the age of the shroud.

The U.S. Research Conference for the Shroud will have 24 hours beginning at midnight Oct. 9 to subject the shroud to modern scientific analysis.

The team is coordinated by two physicists of the U.S. Air Force Academy, Eric J. Jumper and John P. Jackson. It ranges in religious affiliation and includes two experts on forgeries. Other members have backgrounds in such fields as physics, aerodynamics, chemistry, and computer-enhanced image analysis. All are volunteers and are not government subsidized.

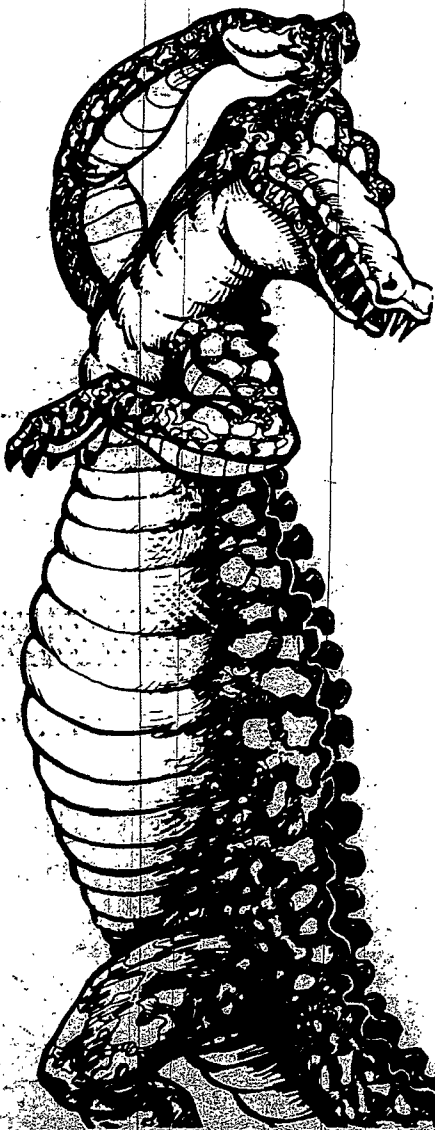
