## Magisterium Series To Focus on Family

For the second year in a row, area Knights of Columbus, among others, are calling in experts to Rochester, for a series of lectures. This year's Magisterium Lecture Series will focus on the family, and the speakers are Dr. Paul Marx, Dr. Harold Voth and Father Vincent Miceli, SJ.

The highly popular series is jointly sponsored this year by the Finger Lakes Chapter of the Knights of Columbus and the Catholic Lawyers Guild of Rochester.

All lectures take place in the auditorium of Our Lady of Mercy High School.

Proceeds from the series will be used to mount a three-day workshop in the Spring on Natural Family Planning.

Opening the series, on Wed., Oct. 4, will be Dr. Marx, a Benedictine priest and sociologist at St. John's University. Dr. Marx is widely known as a spokesman for pro-life movements in this country and will address the topic "Life and the Family."

Dr. Harold Voth, a psychiatrist from the Menninger Clinic and author of the book, "The Castrated Family," will speak on "The Family Today and Tomorrow," on Oct. 15.

Closing the fall series will be Father Miceli's address on "The Church and the Family." Father Miceli, a noted philosopher and lecturer, will speak on Wednesday, Oct. 18.

A press release for the series states: "The Magisterium Lectures again aim to promote the teachings of the Church in the vital area of the family, with special emphasis on the method of Natural Family Planning, approved and encouraged by the Holy Father."

Ticket donations for each of the lectures are \$2.50. Tickets may be purchased,

Organizers of the series also are seeking patrons who will donate \$100 each to cover the cost of the program.

## Stewardship Gears Up

Forty diocesan parishes are enlisting volunteers this week in preparation of a Christian Stewardship Program to be launched next month.

Nearly 7,000 committee persons will be organized to visit the residences of fellow parishioners during a two-week period starting Oct. 8, in efforts to promote the stewardship concept.

The Stewardship Program aims to motivate parishioners to consider a more spiritual outlook on life. The home visits are designed to bring about a willingness on the part of parishioners to commit themselves to Christ, to the Church and to the welfare

of, and cooperation with, the parish community.

The movement is described by the National Catholic Stewardship Council as "a Christian way of life motivating individuals to return to God a portion of the gifts he has given — time, talent and treasure — by sharing one's resources for the benefit of others. It perhaps is easiest identified in the parable of the Good Samaritan."

Home visitors will ask first how the parish staff and committee might help the parishioners, and then what resources the parishioner might be willing to commit toward the parish community.

Father Jerome Robinson, OP, coordinator of the Office of Black Ministries will celebrate a Mass incorporating cultural elements drawn from the Black community at 11 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 24 at Corpus Christi Church.
