Rochester March Scheduled Oct. 8

At least 300 persons are expected to march in downtown Rochester on Prayer for America Sunday, Oct. 8, according to Mary Kelly, chairman of the Rosary March Committee.

Marchers will form at the Liberty Pole at 2:30 p.m. and then proceed along Main Street. "It will be similar to a parade," said Mrs. Kelly, "but instead of bands it will consist of Americans saying prayers for our great country with the theme 'In Thanksgiving for God's Ten Commandments.'"

The route will be about one mile and take between 20 minutes and a half-hour to

Sr. Emmanuel

The Mass of Christian Burial for Sister Emmanuel Crawford, SSI, was offered Sept. 13, 1978, in the Motherhouse Chapel. Sister Emmanuel died Sept. 11 at St. Joseph Convent in the 54th year of her religious life. She was 92 years old.

Principal concelebrant of the Mass was Father William Brown, pastor of Immaculate Conception Church in Fulton. Others celebrating were Father Robert Hall, pastor of St. Mary's, Oswego; Msgr. John M. Duffy and Fathers Thomas Statt and Frederick Heifrich. Also present were Msgr. William Naughton and Father Frederick Bush.

Sister Emmanuel entered the St. Joseph congregation in 1925 from St. Mary's Parish, Oswego. She was a graduate of Oswego Normal School and had taught for several years in Fulton. As a Sister of St. Joseph she taught at St. Patrick's, Seneca Falls, for 18 years, serving also as principal for six years. She was principal and teacher for six years at Nativity, Brockport, and St. Michael's, Penn Yan, and for three years at St. Mary's, Canandaigua. She taught also at Blessed Sacrament, Rochester, and St. Francis de Sales, Geneva. She retired from teaching in 1962, and for six years served at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, as recep-

tionist and apostolic visitor to the patients. In 1970 she retired to her community's infirmary.

Sister Emmanuel leaves one sister, Mrs. Sidney LaFave of Oswego, and four nieces, Mrs. Robert Dailey of Pittsford, Mrs. John Cassidy of Old Greenwich, Conn., Mrs. Joseph Murphy of Leonia, N.J., and Mrs. Vincent Connelly of New York City.
