Father Messner, son of the late Henry and Anna Messner, was the brother of Sister Mary Patrice, SSJ Other, survivors are his step mother, Mrs. Ella Messner, also of Rochester, and a half-sister Mrs. Harry Dean of Birmingham, Ala.

He attended St. Andrew's Seminary and was graduated from Aquinas Institute. His education was continued at St. Mary's and Woodstock colleges, both in Maryland. Between times, in 1937, he entered the Society of Jesus at St. Andrew-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, and was ordained June 18, 1950.
