## Harold Voth To Speak Here

Dr. Harold Voth, the second speaker in the Magisterium Lecture Series this year, has made a name for himself in recent years by insisting that "a strong family, in which the roles of the father and mother are distinct and clear, forms the foundation for normal personality development and for a strong society."



**DR. VOTH**  
shortly publish a book on the topic.

Dr. Voth is a psychiatrist with the Menninger Foundation in Topeka, Kansas.

He is perhaps best known to the lay public as the author of *The Castrated Family*. Among his peers, however, he is also known as a champion of the idea that homosexuality constitutes psychopathology and is abnormal. In this regard, he has acted against measures which would remove discrimination against homosexuals in housing, employment and public accommodations in New York City.

His principal work, however, is in the area of autokinesis and personality organization. He will
