

# Speaker Sees Family As God's Sanctuary

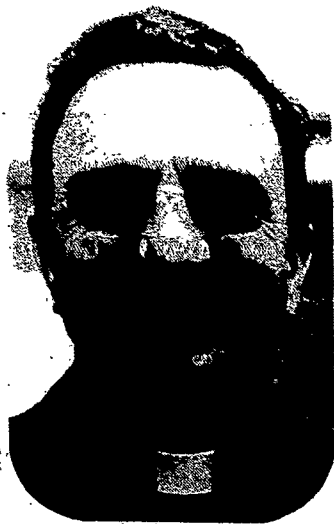

"The family is the domestic sanctuary of God," a noted author and lecturer said here last week.

Father Vincent Micelli, SJ, the third and final speaker in the fall program of the Magisterium Lecture Series, was in town to speak on the Church and Family.

Father Micelli said in an interview that marriage today faces many dangers, chief among which is the societal tendency to "reduce marital acts to recreation."

He said this is happening on college campuses, where cohabitation is present, in the notion of "trial marriages," and in the trend to easy divorce.

"In the material world, if you split the atom it's disastrous," he said. In the spiritual world, the splitting of the married couple is also disastrous.

As did other speakers before him in the lecture series, Father Micelli cited the fall of the Roman Empire as analogous to the current situation in the United States today.

He said that at that time there too existed easy divorce, homosexuality and unnatural sexual activity, experimentation with sex and an increase in the abortion rate.

The last he said was evidence of "hatred for children," evidence of "grave ego-centric love." He bemoaned the loss of "self-sacrifice in marriage."

Sex, he said, is "a mysterious vocation," and when responsibility for sex is lost, perversions abound.

He said the atmosphere today is one of "excessive sex

and violence." Such springs from a "desire to dominate the other's body, to use it as a means to one's gratification." This "depersonalization of sex," he said, "means that there is no mutual self donation."
