The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Father Richard Marks, SVD, last Friday at the Divine Word Seminary, Conesus.

Father Marks died at the seminary Oct. 25, 1978, in his 78th year. He had been living in retirement there after many years in the mission field, chiefly in the Philippine Islands. He was born in Germany Jan. 1, 1901. He leaves a brother, Joseph, and a sister, Elizabeth, both in West Germany.

Burial took place Saturday at his order's establishment, Girard, Pa.

Will Poland Be Visited?

Vatican City (RNS) — The Polish Roman Catholic episcopate has invited Pope John Paul II to visit his homeland next year.

Poland and he replied that he was too young to stay away from his homeland forever.

Pope Paul VI had planned to travel to Poland in 1966 to

celebrate the 1,000th anniversary of that nation's conversion to Christianity but East-West political tensions prevented the pilgrimage from being undertaken.
