

# Geneva DeSales Under Discussion

Recently, area educators, priests, principals and parents met to discuss the future growth of DeSales High School. Parish representatives from Auburn, Newark, Phelps, Canandaigua, Stanley, Waterloo, Lyons, Penn Yan and Geneva were in agreement that Christian secondary education in the Finger Lakes is here to stay.

This Task Force was called together by William Koebel, DeSales Board of Trustee president. Its mission is to

study the future of Catholic secondary education in the region.

The principle recommendation from the Task Force was that the Board of Trustees hire a marketing specialist to present the school to the public. It was the common opinion that the school has much to offer in the way of an alternative to the government school of today.

It also was stated that the

school for the present should not move from its current mortgage free site. A proposal to change the name of the school to "DeSales Regional High School", will be discussed at the next Board of Trustees meeting.

Members of the Task Force were asked to feed information back to the steering committee. Future meetings will be held, when necessary, in order to evaluate data from the regional representatives.

## Cardinal Wright Ailing

# All But One Renamed to Curia

Vatican City (RNS) — Pope John Paul II has reappointed all but one cardinal to their posts as heads of the nine congregations of the Roman Curia.

There has been no word yet that the Pope will reappoint the ailing American Cardinal John J. Wright, 69, as head of the the Congregation for the Clergy. The American prelate, who underwent surgery for cataracts in August, suffers from circulatory problems.

Pope John Paul II reappointed French Cardinal Paul Philippe, 73,

as prefect of the Congregation for Oriental Churches.

He reconfirmed the 64-year-old Australian Cardinal James R. Knox as prefect of the Congregation for Discipline of Sacraments and Divine Worship. He also requested Brazilian Cardinal Agnelo Rossi, 65, to resume his post as prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples.

Italian Cardinal Corrado Bafale, 75, was renamed prefect of the Congregation for Causes of Saints. French Cardinal

Gabriel-Marie Garonne, 77, is once again the prefect of the Congregation for Catholic Education.

He also reappointed Cardinal Eduardo Pironio of Argentina, 57, prefect of the Congregation for Religious and Secular Institutes; Yugoslav Cardinal-Franjo Seper, 73, prefect of the Congregation for Doctrine of the Faith, and Italian Cardinal Sebastiano Baggio, 65, prefect of the Congregation for Bishops.

Italian Cardinal Pericle Felici, 67, was reconfirmed as prefect of the Supreme

Tribunal of the Apostolic Signature and as president of the Pontifical Commission for the Revision of the Code of Canon Law.

(Editor's Note: A report that the Pope had dismissed Cardinal Felici from his post with the Commission for the Revision of the Code of Canon Law apparently was erroneous.)

In the first of his reappointments, Pope John Paul II said he would retain French Cardinal Jean Villot, 73, as his secretary of state, but only temporarily.

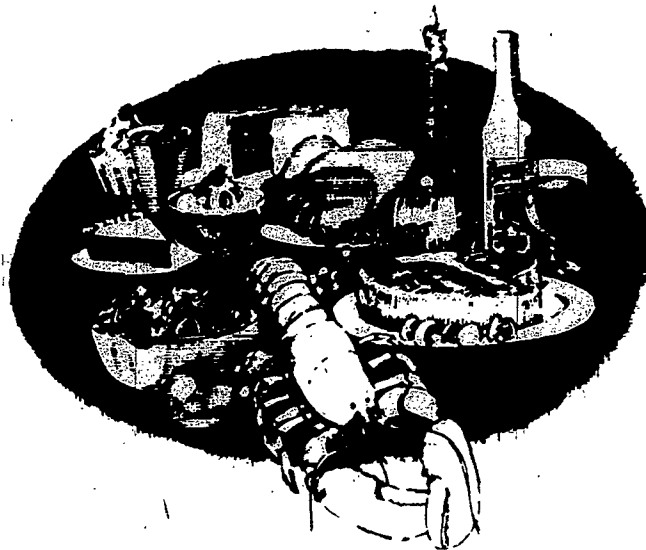
