Created by our nation's bishops in 1970, the Campaign for Human Development is a response of the Catholic Church to the reality of poverty affecting millions of people in the United States. It is estimated that more than 40 million people in our country are caught in a vicious cycle that keeps them poor and powerless. The Campaign for Human Development seeks to enable these people to find long-range solutions to circumstances locking them into poverty.

The funding of self-help poverty projects is an important aspect of the CHD education/action program. Our generous response to the annual November Campaign Appeal provides the funds for grants to projects designed to help poor people help themselves.
