Two hundred and one men and women who are serving as lectors in 43 parishes of the diocese were confirmed in their ministry recently at ceremonies in Horseheads and Rochester. The lectors had completed a course devised by Father Robert Kennedy and his Department of Liturgy.

Bishop Dennis W. Hickey celebrated Mass for both groups — Nov. 5 at St. Mary Our Mother and Nov. 12 at Annunciation. He told the lectors that preparedness and punctuality were basic to their mission. They should study

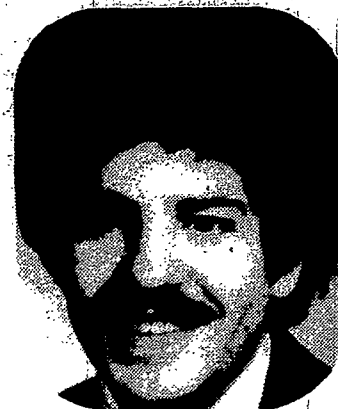
and practice, and they should keep the schedule, lest the reading be done by an unprepared substitute, the bishop said. He distributed certificates commissioning each lector for two years.
