Cdl. Frings Dies at 91, Aided Jews

Cologne, West Germany (RNS) —Cardinal Joseph Frings, the outspoken Archbishop of Cologne from 1942 to 1969 who defied the Nazis in World War II and led the progressive wing at the Second Vatican Council, died of heart failure here Dec. 17, 1978. He was 91 years old.

Cardinal Frings spent nearly half of his 60-year career as head of the 2.6 million member archdiocese, but his influence was felt across Europe and in the top councils of the Church.

In 1943 and 1944 Archbishop Frings preached sermons from the pulpit of his cathedral denouncing Nazi persecution of Jews as "an injustice that cries to the heavens."

He was made a cardinal by Pope Pius XII in February 1946.

N.Y. Times Accused Of Bias

New York (RNS) — The National News Council has accused the New York Times of biased reporting for the third time on similar complaints — that the newspaper unnecessarily singles out Catholics in stories on abortion.

The council charged that the Times is "either insensitive to justifiable criticism or condones careless editing."

Times spokespersons deny anti-Catholic bias in reporting, but say it is the newspaper's policy "not to reply to any accusations made by the National News Council. We don't participate in National News Council in any way."
