

Selection Hearing, Priorities Are DPC Topics

Canandaigua—Members of the Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) will participate in a hearing for the Bishops Selection Committee and will discuss diocesan priorities at their regular meeting Jan. 20.

Those two topics are the only ones the DPC has authorization to discuss, pending the selection of a new bishop.

DPC members recently received the proposal of diocesan priorities written by the Ministerial Review Committee (MRC). The MRC used comments from all three diocesan consultative bodies, and from the regional assemblies to compile its proposal.

The MRC's ordering of priorities is: Education (especially for leadership); Family; Evangelization and the Unchurched; Youth; Diocesan Organization Structure; Liturgy; Finances;

The MRC's proposal includes descriptions of various efforts the committee feels are needed in each area, and includes some recommendations for starting new programs.

Among the new recommendations is one that the
