## Regent Scholarship Winners

The New York State Education Department has announced the names of those high school students who have won Regents Scholarships this year. These scholarship awards are effective as of the 1979-80 academic year. Each scholarship entitles the recipient to an award of \$250 a year for up to five years of study at an approved program in New York State.

The winners are the candidates who earned the highest scores in each county on either the American College Testing Program (ACT) Assessment or the College Board's Scholastic Ability Test (SAT) prior to Nov. 1, 1978. ## No Tuition Increase

Geneva — There will be no tuition increase next year at De Sales High School, for the first time since 1975. The board of trustees unanimously voted against a rise in tuition, at their Feb. 12 meeting, and approved instead a "negotiated tuition" plan.

The tuition rate that will remain in effect for the 1979-1980 school year is \$450 per student. Families with two students pay \$650; with three, \$750. The actual cost per pupil is expected to be \$1,100.

Frank Caravita, finance committee chairman, said that "negotiated tuition" — that is, voluntary contributions by those who can afford them — should offset the five percent increase in expenses anticipated for 1979-1980.

Principal Edward Tracey and the vice principal, Sister Mary Maywalt, were chosen to be the negotiators. It was noted that the diocese currently provides tuition subsidies for 13 students, and that details of this program are available at the school's guidance office.

By unanimous vote, trustees changed the name of the SOS Committee to "De Sales Development Committee," to "reflect the current image of the school," according to their report. Dominick Emmi, newly elected to the board, was named chairman of the building and equipment committee.

### 1979 Trade Fair

The Rochester Junior Achievement Trade Fair will be at Midtown Plaza, Feb. 23-24. Some 750 students from city and county high schools and industrial advisors have manufactured and packaged various products. On sale during the fair will be various items including candles, coat hangers, flower arrangements and toys. The fair will be open to the public during regular store hours.
