

Day of Prayer



The group consists of 28 members, all of whom also belong to the Diocesan Festival Choir comprising some 80 singers, under the direction of Sister Virginia Hogan


The Liturgical Group also will perform at Masses at St. John the Evangelist in Spencerport at 5:30 p.m., Saturday, March 3, and at
