

Liturgy Issues 'Waiting' Package

Waiting for a new bishop to be named puts the Diocese of Rochester in a unique situation this Lent. In response to that situation, the diocesan Liturgy Office team has put together a package of information, prayers and liturgical rites which it is sending to all parishes, schools and religious education personnel.

Included in the package, entitled, "A Living Sign of Christ Present/Waiting for a Bishop in the Diocese of Rochester, New York," is

the full rite of Evening Prayer, biographical sketches of each bishop of the diocese by Father Robert McNamara, information on the role of a bishop, explanations of his vestments, stories about famous bishops in history, an essay on fasting, and the now familiar Prayer for a New Bishop.

According to a cover letter sent with the package, portions of the material are adapted from a similar package distributed in the Diocese of Albany prior to the ordination of Bishop Howard J. Hubbard.

'Candidates' Pledge Selves

Ordination Rites For Thomas Celso Slated March 9

Deacon B. Thomas Celso will weave the symbol of the Cross and a quote from St. Ignatius of Antioch through the ordination rites which will elevate him to the priesthood on March 9 in St. Thomas the Apostle Church at 7:30 p.m.

St. Ignatius wrote, "My spirit is given over to the humble service of the cross, which is a stumbling block to unbelievers, but to us salvation and eternal life."

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, apostolic administrator, will be the presiding prelate over the rites for the son of Mr. and Mrs. Bernard J. Celso of Newark.

The ordinand attended St. Michael's School in Newark, St. Andrew's Seminary, Newark Senior High School, Monroe Community College, State University College at Brockport, St. John Fisher College and St. Bernard's Seminary, where he earned a Master's degree in Divinity.

Father Celso has worked for the Family Camp and Teen Seminar programs at Camp Stella Maris, in St. Stanislaus and St. Andrew parishes, at the Pastoral Office, at St. James Mercy Hospital in

Hornell, and has served as a deacon at Holy Cross Parish and at St. Thomas. He took his Clinical Pastoral Education at Mercy Hospital in Springfield, Mass.
