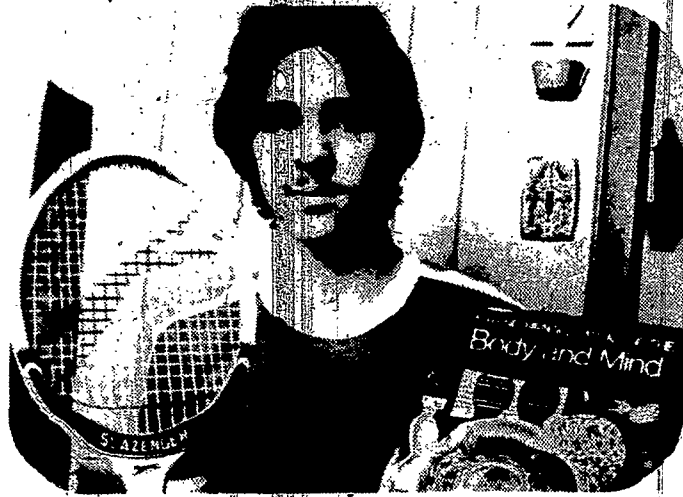

Seder Supper

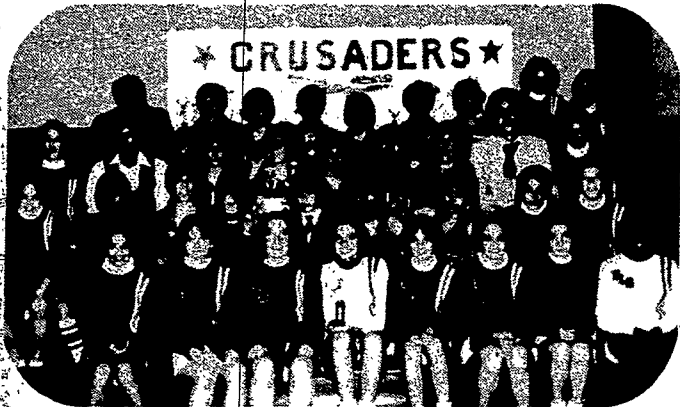
