### Students Compete in 'Mock Trial'

The first round of this year's Monroe County Mock Trial Tournament took place recently at R. L. Thomas High School in Webster. Eight area schools, including St. Agnes High, vied for top honors in the event sponsored by the Institute on Law and the Social Studies in cooperation with the County Bar Foundation.

Competitors took the part of respondents or petitioners

in mock trials. Judge Eugene W. Bergin presided over the trials and selected the teams who performed the best.

The St. Agnes team, as respondents, were matched against the Brighton High School team as petitioners. Judge Bergin gave two decisions. St. Agnes, coached by Sister Patricia Frisk, won the case on its legal merits, while the Brighton team won over all on techniques of

presentation. The final score was 71-69.

St. Agnes team members included Barbara Hellenschmidt, Tamie DiNolfo and Kathy Komorowski, as lawyers; Carol Rinehart, Carol Thompson and Mary Conheady, as witnesses.

Winning teams in the second round of the tournament will present a mock trial at the Hall of Justice on April 4 at 7:30 p.m.
