Pope Approves Warning to French Theologian

Vatican City (RNS) - Pope John Paul II, in his first such act as pontiff, has approved a Vatican declaration stating that a book by a French Catholic theologian presents views which conflict with Catholic dogma.

The Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (the former Holy Office) released a carefully-worded statement which declared that Father R. P. Jacques Pohier's book, "Quand Je Dis Dieu" ("When I Say God"), contained "affirmations which

manifestly fail to conform to Revelation and (the) teaching of the Church."

The statement was signed by Yugoslav Cardinal Franjo Seper, prefect of the congregation, and Belgian Archbishop Jean Jerome Hamer, its secretary.

The statement goes no further in explaining what, if any, action will now be taken against the theologian. It makes no mention of excommunication or other punishment. Nor does the statement forbid Catholics from reading the book.

City Declares 'Landmarks' At Seminary

St. Bernard's Seminary has had three of its structures declared "landmarks" by the Rochester City Planning Commission.

According to a spokesperson for the commission, the main building, the chapel/dining room building, and the statue of Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, founding Bishop of Rochester and founder of the seminary, have all been declared landmarks, and therefore any changes in their appearance come under the purview of the city commission.

The buildings were designed by Andrew Jackson Warner, the commission spokesperson said last week.

Warner was a local architect, a partner in the firm of Warner and Brackett. The buildings were constructed by Hiram Edgerton, a local contractor, of stone from a quarry near Hanford Landing Road.

Eye Screening Tests Available

Elmira-St. Joseph's Hospital continues to offer free eye screenings for detection of Diabetic Retinopathy. Diabetic Retinopathy, a serious manifestation of diabetes, is the most common cause of new blindness in persons 41-60 years of age, and the second most common cause in the 21-40 age group. A person who has had diabetes for ten or more years may suffer from this eye condition.

Testing takes no more than a half hour, and is done by eye specialists on the first four Tuesdays of each month between 1:30 and 4 p.m. in Room 107 of the Elmira Medical Arts Building, by appointment only.

Any person having diabetes who does not visit an ophthalmologist on a regular basis for eye care may make an appointment by calling St. Joseph's Ambulatory Care Services at 733-6541, ext 539.

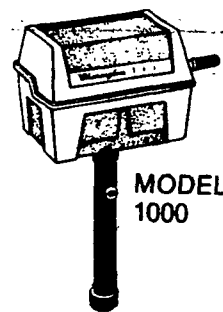
