3 Firsts for Courier RapAround Wins Again

Fort Lauderdale, Fla. — The oft-honored Courier-Journal section RapAround received new recognition here last week when it was awarded first prize for Youth Coverage for the second year in a row by the national Catholic Press Association.

The diocesan newspaper also won two first prizes for excellence from the Catholic Major Markets Newspaper Association, meeting in conjunction with the CPA annual convention.

The advertising first prize

awards were for Best Series of Food Store Advertising Appearing in a Catholic Newspaper and for Best Original Art Appearing in a Catholic Newspaper.

The judges called RapAround "a wealth of news about young people --pictures, names, activities --well laid out, interesting and altogether a lively section."

The section which was instituted in 1975 was awarded a third prize by the CPA that year. The next year it won second and in 1977 won the first prize

RapAround, whose editor is Joan M. Smith, also won a 1977 first prize from the York State Press New Association for Best Promotional Idea.

The CMMNA award for Food Store Advertising was for a series of ads from Star Supermarkets. The first prize for Original Advertising Art was for a series of McCurdy's women's fashion ads which ran over a 20week period with special color overlays.
