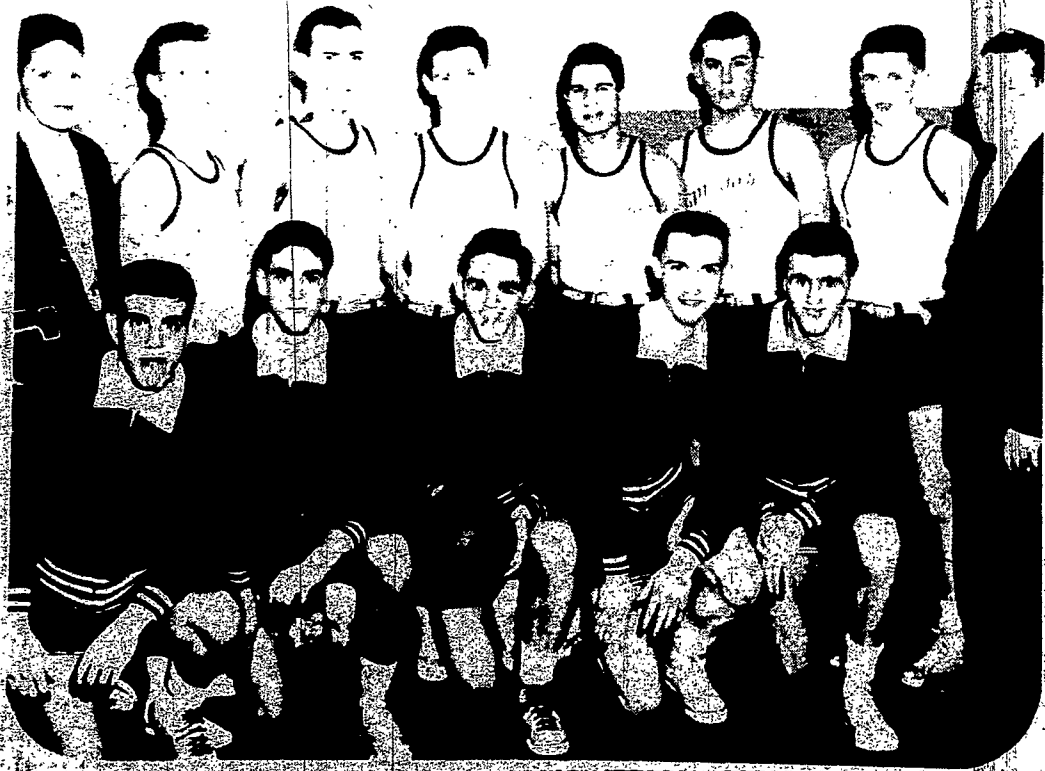
Talented Matt has chalked up success as an actor, scholar, and sportsman.
