'Babies in Lab' Is Seminar Topic

A seminar entitled Babies In The Lab will be held at 8 p.m. Wednesday, May 16, at the Academy of Medicine, 1441 East Ave. under the auspices of the St. Thomas More Lawyers' Guild.

Discussions will deal with test tube babies and the use of live fetuses for scientific research.

William D. McGinn, a local attorney, will explain the legal status of the unborn. Dr. Richard A. Doherty, an Associate Professor of Pediatrics and Genetics at the University of Rochester, will talk about the benefits, while Dr. John S. Whelan, a local gynecologist, will point out the dangers to medicine and society of prenatal experimentation and test tube babies. Father William B. Smith, STD, Dean of Moral Theology at St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers, will consider some moral and ethical perspectives.

Joseph G. DeMaria, president of the Lawyers Guild, stated that "our purpose in sponsoring this program is to focus the public's attention on compelling legal, moral and medical issues so that the

public can more intelligently determine the full ramifications of society's direction."

A panel discussion will follow with questions from the audience. The public is invited free of charge.

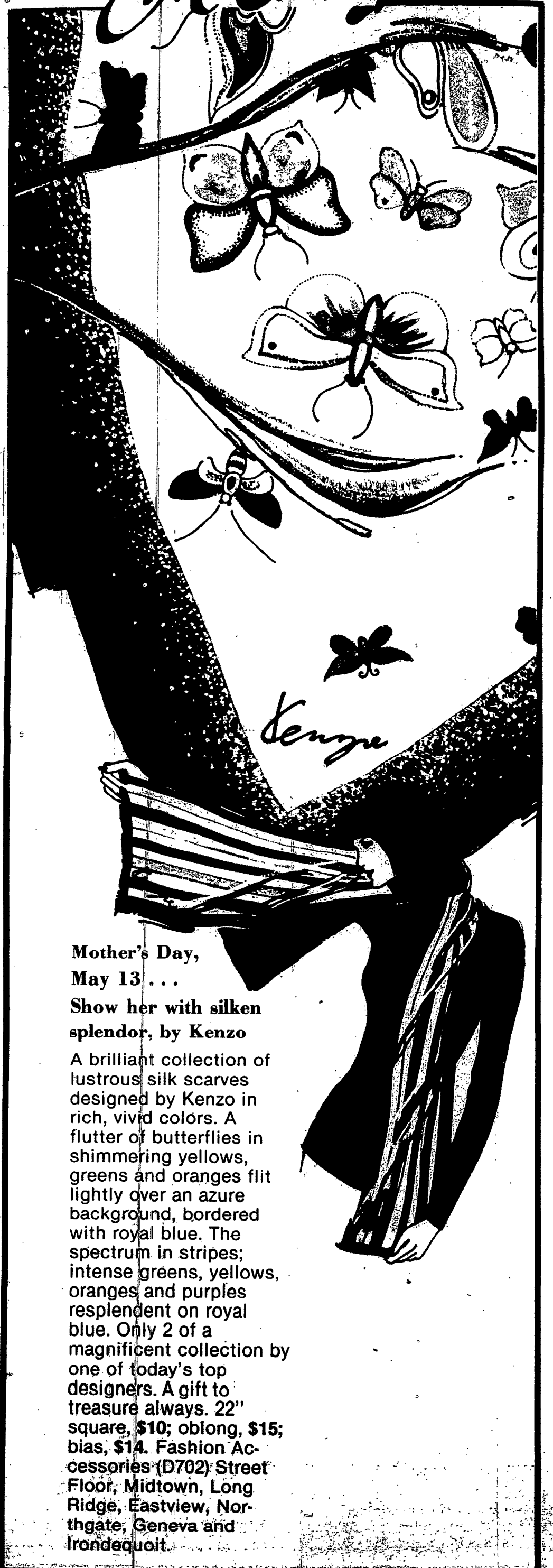
