Kinsman stated that some have continued to report visions on the tabe hacle itself.

Kinsman said that ather Conmy had never extensed to him the wish to have the veil buried with him. He said that the priest wanted the veil "treated with all the sacredness that man can provide for it."


Even during the height of interest in the visions some parishioners expressed the wish that the events had hever happened.

Describing herself as "high Episcopalian," Mrs. Hart said that it was her estimation that "he would have wanted the veil" to remain in the church, "because so many people had so much grace" from viewing it.

Mrs. Hart reported that "we have documented most of what we've seen," including healings, both spiritual and physical, that took place as a result of a visit to the church.

A visit to the church May 8 showed a contrast to earlier times. While in the past there had been a constant stream of visitors to the church, it stood empty.

The church's rug, worn out by the constant traffic, has been replaced and the table of rosaries and scapulars that had stood in the rear of the church is gone. The tabernacle, on the side altar to the left of the main altar, once the object of attention for thousands of visitors, reflects light from the windows off its golden, unveiled, dome.
