Mainstreaming, in-troducing physically handicapped people into the academic and work aspects of everyday community life, has its advocates and opponents. One person who has strong views on the subject as well as first hand experience with the process, is Marca Grattet. a senior at St. Agnes High School.

Marca has cerebral palsy and says about the move her parents made to mainstream her, "It was the most important decision they made in my life.

RapAround asked her why?

"If you are going to work and live in the community you have to be a part of it, she answered. She explained that not mainstreaming handicapped students with normal intelligence can be a problem because being in classes with the same few students and not being aware of set academic standards can be restrictive.

Marca admitted that when. first mainstreamed it was a shock to her because of the fast pace around her. It wasn't long however, before she had settled in at St. John's on Humboldt Street and went to work creating a place for herself.

Marca has a bubbly personality which immediately puts those around her at ease. Behind this outgoing graciousness, however is a

Her philosophy is the gentle approach and therefore, there are no foot-stomping, aggressive barrages from her to make the public aware of the handicapped people and their problems. Though she is aware that this is needed she noted, "You have to work with people to change things that have to be changed. Not be an opposing group."

Another aspect of social concern she once didn't appreciate was the campaigns and telethons which she considered a form of begging. When she was contacted by the Rochester Easter Seal program she at first refused to become involved. Then on, contemplating the matter, one constant thought kept repeating itself — "You can't change things if you stay out

There is no embarrassment in discussing with Marca her disability — she doesn't apologize for it nor hide behind it.

"Being handicapped is a part of me as a person that won't ever change," she declared, "but it's not all me. I'm a person first and then a handicapped person and I don't expect the world togbe shaped for me."

She best appreciates her fellow companions when, if she asks for help and at that particular moment they are busy and on the run, they are honest with her and tell her no. "I think that's great," shesmiled adding, "I don't want them to just drop everything to help me."

Marca puts strong emphasis on the word person and in her quest to remain an individual and not be stereotyped, she

tries to explain the illogic of society's tendency to do so.

"Just because a person has a disability," she explained, "doesn't mean they understand everyone that has a disability. And the reverse is true. Just because a person doesn't have a disability doesn't mean they don't understand the problems."

Another matter which bothers Marca, is seeing others (disabled) without motivation "to do anything about their lives."

"I'm pushed from something inside," she said of her own motivation. "Since I was oung I knew the importance of education and I still want to learn more."

True to her goal, Marca will continue her learning experiences at the University of Arizona come September. She will pursue a liberal arts course in preparation for either a career in law or hospital administration. She is also excited about attending the State University at Albany this summer for a course designed to prepare handicapped students for college. In fact, the course begins the day after her graduation from St. Agnes on June 21. She'll hardly have time to feel the pangs of parting from St. Agnes or her fellow classmates, but they'll miss her.

"She's been a real plus for us," commented Sister Anne Guerin, principal, "and we're going to miss her.'
