after the Gospel and began with the questioning of the candidates by the Pope.

Then as the congregation sang the litany of the saints the Holy Father imposed hands on each of the candidates. His two cardinal assistants did likewise.

Then each of the 26 cardinals and 88 bishops in attendance also imposed hands on the new bishops. Bishops Hogan, Hickey and McCafferty took part in the ancient rite as did Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York City.

Then came the consecrating prayer which calls the Holy Spirit to come in all His fullness on the newly ordained. This was followed by the anointing with chrism, the oil used in Baptism,

Confirmation and Orders. Here, it was poured on the head that the Spirit might penetrate the inmost being of the new bishops.

Presentations were made — the book, "take it and preach it"; the ring, a sign of faith; the miter and crozier, sign of pastoral duty and care of the flock.

The Holy Father walking in the semicircle of new bishops congratulated each with the embrace of peace which drew applause. Then all the cardinals and bishops repeated the papal gesture with the new bishops.

The bishops just ordained then proceeded through the aisles, imparting blessings on the people amid burst after burst of cheering and applause. Then came the final procession with another deafening roar of acclamation for the Holy Father.
