Br. Feerick to Leave Post as BK Principal

With eight years of administrative duties behind him, the last two as principal of Bishop Kearney High School, Brother Thomas Feerick will be returning to classroom duties full time. Brother Brian Walsh will be his successor as principal of BK.

Brother Feerick will be leaving the Rochester area in June, to attend the International Tertianship Program in Rome. He will assume his teaching position at Blessed Sacrament High School, New Rochelle, in January. He will replace Brother Joseph Clark, first principal of BK, allowing him to attend the second academic session of the Tertianship Program.


As principal of BK, Brother Feerick initiated the use of computers for course scheduling and report cards, the Kokua fund raising drive and the PAX program which provides spiritual retreat days for each class.

Before coming to Bishop Kearney, Brother's assignments took him to Damien Memorial High School in Honolulu, and Bergen High School in New Jersey. He also served as principal of Bishop Hendricken High School in Warwick, Rhode Island. While there, he along with eight brother colleagues managed to turn the school's declining enrollment around.

Job changes are always good for the work perspective and Brother is looking forward to returning to the classroom. "I'm anxious to get out of administration," he said and added, "If you stay in it too long you become frustrated."

Several others are leaving the BK community. Sister Grace Marie Hansen, chairperson of the Language Department, Spanish teacher and moderator for the Spanish Honor Society will work in the Spanish ministry in the Connecticut area.
