

### Brother Becomes Priest

Father Charles J. Kociolek, CSC, who was on the Cardinal Mooney High School staff as a Holy Cross Brother, was ordained to the priesthood June 9 at North Easton, Mass., for the Eastern Province of his order.

Auxiliary Bishop James H. MacDonald, CSC, of Hamilton, Ont., was the ordaining prelate. Father Kociolek celebrated his first Mass at St. Paul's Church in Jersey City, and on June 24

offered a Mass of Thanksgiving at St. Lawrence Church, Greece. A reception followed.

From 1969 through 1975, the new priest was variously treasurer at Cardinal Mooney, religious superior and moderator of the parents' guild. He began theological studies in 1976 at Moreau Seminary, Notre Dame, Ind., and served his diaconate last year at Most Holy Trinity Church, Saco, Me.

#### Paul V. Imhof

The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Paul V. Imhof, 71, on June 18, 1979, in the Church of the Annunciation, Albuquerque, New Mexico. Mr. Imhof, a Rochesterian who belonged to the Knights of Columbus, and to the Adoration Society here, died June 14. He had lived in Albuquerque for the past year and a half.

He was a member also of the Alhambra and the Rosary for Peace Campaign in Rochester.

Mr. Imhof, who spent half a century in Rochester, ran a hardware store on Dewey Avenue for 16 years, and thereby became an inventor. He patented, made and marketed devices his customers needed dabbled in various field, from advertising to taxi driving and ran a furniture store for awhile in Williamsburg, Va., and a fabric store here.

Survivors include his widow, Josephine, three daughters and two sons, who are Mrs. Anthony (Joanne) Matrange of Houston, Tex.; Mary Ann Imhof of Chicago; Rosemary Imhof Salerno of Albuquerque; Paul R. Imhof of Phoenix, Ariz., and James B. Imhof of Albuquerque. In addition, there are a sister, Sister Marie Rose of Holy Rosary Convent in Erie, Pa.; a brother, M.J. Imhof of Rochester, and a sister-in-law, Monica Imhof, Albuquerque.

Mr. Imhof was buried in Gate of Heaven Cemetery, Albuquerque.

Sister St. Margaret Murphy, a Sister of St. Joseph for 61 years and a longtime member of the Nazareth Academy staff, died June 14, 1979, at the age of 82.

She was chairman of the art department 1955-1969.
