

2 Pastors, Youth Director Named

Father Daniel Holland has been appointed pastor of St. Patrick's, Elmira, and Father Paul Schnacky, pastor of St. Joseph's, Wayland. Father David Mura will take over direction of youth retreat work.

The appointments, effective in early September, are the first made by Bishop Matthew H. Clark. Announcing them, Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey pointed out that only an Ordinary can approve such appointments and that the diocese was without an Ordinary from November to May. He said that a number of vacancies remain to be filled, or are imminent.

The two pastorates supplied have been vacant for several months — that in Wayland since the death last March 30 of Father James F. Baker. The Elmira church has been administered by Father Kevin P. Murphy.

Father Holland has been associate pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle, Irondequoit, since 1973. For the previous two years he had been in charge of plans, and their implementation, for the Year of Renewal. He was assistant

director of CCD, 1966-69, and director, 1969-72. He served two terms in the Priests Council and was on the Priests Personnel Board, 1976-79.

Father Holland attended

St. Monica's School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries and the University of Rochester. He was ordained here in June, 1965, and assigned for a year to Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Father Schnacky, ordained June 6, 1953, has spent his priestly life in parish work. He has been associate pastor of St. Philip Neri since 1976, and for a year preceding that assignment was pastor of St. Patrick's, Cato. He had served the previous decade at Holy Redeemer in Rochester's inner city.

Father Schnacky attended St. Boniface School, Aquinas Institute and the diocesan seminaries. His first assignment was to the staff of St. Michael's, Rochester. He has served also at St. Alphonsus and Holy Family, Auburn; St. Peter and Paul and St. Salome's, Rochester.

Father Mura, eight years a priest, has been associated with Immaculate Conception, Ithaca; Christ the King, Irondequoit, and, since 1976, St. Mary's, Watkins Glen. He served his diaconate year at Holy Trinity, Webster. He has been involved with a number of mental health organizations. His new work includes Teen Seminar and related activities, and the director's position is one developed by Father Robert Hammond in his 12 years in youth work. Father Hammond wants to try something else, Bishop Hickey remarked. Father Mura attended St.

Ambrose and St. John's (Greece) parish schools, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's and North American College and Gregorian University in Rome. He was ordained May 29, 1971. He has been a member of the Board of Visitors, Craig Developmental Center, and the boards of directors of the Mental Health Association of Tompkins County and of Schuyler County. He is on the board of the Schuyler County Chapter, American Cancer Society, is a member of the Schuyler County Task Force on Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and is chaplain to, and a member of, the Watkins Glen Fire Department.

JPC Urges Reform Of Jury Selection

The Judicial Process Commission has issued a statement praising the Urban League report "The Issue of Racial Discrimination in the Monroe County Jury System."

The report said the community must act to reform the machinery by which it administers justice. It said that blacks are discriminated against in jury selection.

The JPC statement said, "We find appalling the fact that a vital segment of our

community is virtually prohibited from partaking in the trial jury process. What is equally disturbing is the fact that this prohibition, based solely on grounds of racial bias, enjoys the facade of legality."

In its statement, the JPC urges citizens and officials to "rectify the discriminatory elimination of jurors based solely on racial, ethnic and economic grounds as well as on the basis of sex or nationality."
