Msgr. E. McAniff Dies at Age 61

Msgr. Edward J. McAniff, who was secretary to the late Bishop James E. Kearney for eight years and pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church for five, died July 26, 1979, in Genesee Hospital, three days before his 61st birthday. In ill health for many years, he had retired in 1968 and had been living on the Pittsford-Victor road.


The Mass of Christ the High Priest was concelebrated Sunday night at Old St. Mary's, where Msgr. McAniff's brother, Msgr. James McAniff, is pastor. A pontifical concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was offered Monday morning, also at St. Mary's.

Principal celebrants of the two Masses were, respectively, Bishop Joseph L. Hogan and Bishop Matthew H. Clark. The homilists were Fathers Charles Bennett and Bruce Ammering.

Msgr. McAniff was born July 29, 1918. He attended St. Augustine's School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries. Bishop Kearney ordained him Dec. 18, 1943, in Sacred Heart Cathedral and assigned him to the cathedral staff, where, in addition to parish duties, he had the particular responsibility of assisting in the arrangements for diocesan-wide celebrations. His annual adult instruction courses became well known. He became Bishop Kearney's secretary in June, 1955, and continued in the post until June, 1963, when he was appointed pastor of Blessed Sacrament.

Pope John XXIII made him a Papal Chamberlain on July 31, 1959. He retired from the Blessed Sacrament pastorate in June, 1968.

Surviving besides his brother are a sister and brother-in-law, Julia and Francis Dollard


