At Your Parish... Family Prayer Highlighted At Annunciation Parish

Father William Graf, pastor of the Church of the Annunciation, 1754 Norton St., Rochester, announced recently the beginning of a family-centered parish renewal program known as Families For Prayer. Father Graf feels the program is "one of the most important undertakings of his parish in recent years," according to a release.

Letters and brochures were mailed to all families in the parish outlining and explaining the program which begins Oct. 14 and continues for a period of five weeks.

Speaking about the program, Father Graf pointed out that communication and the cultivation of religious values within the family are crucial elements in a happy and wholesome family life.

"Through this family-centered parish renewal program, the effort to open the hearts of families to the Presence of God is foremost. It is a simple program based on the belief that prayer with and for each other is fundamental to happy family life," Father Graf said.

He added that the Families for Prayer program explains why a family should pray together and shows each

family a way to pray together. "It asks not only for occasional prayer but for a commitment to daily prayer as a family."

The Families for Prayer program at Annunciation is part of a nationwide movement, with headquarters in Albany. Its founder and director is Father Patrick

Peyton, C.F.C., who originated the slogans "The family that prays together stays together" and "A world at prayer is a world at peace."

Sister Joyce, from the Albany headquarters, stated that Annunciation is the first parish in Rochester to implement the Families for Prayer program.

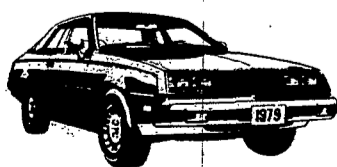

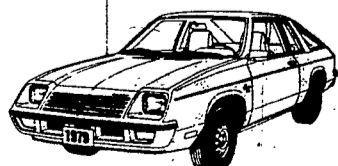

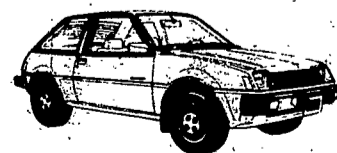
