DeSales Expands Academics

According to Edward Tracey, Geneva DeSales principal, regionalism, a concept that has been pursued over the past few years has taken root and will spread during the 1979-80 school year. Students from outside Geneva will number 15 per cent of the the DeSales population.

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School tuition will remain at \$450 per student, with families with two students attending the school paying \$650 and those with three students, \$750. Increases in operational costs will be absorbed in gifts and in fundraising activities. A negotiated tuition plan, under the direction of Sister Mary Maywalt, vice principal, will be put into operation this Fall.

Over 60 courses will be offered this year with major regents sequences available in Art, Science, Math, French, Spanish, Business Education. The addition of Music Theory II has made a major in music possible and an Advanced Placement History course has been added to the senior electives. Seniors may now earn up to six credits as participants in the Nazareth College Freshman Program.

The Religion Department intends to be more visible and supportive of the spiritual and temporal needs of the community. Mack Spellecy, department chairman, his staff, and several students are preparing to present a series of topics to be broadcast over WGVA.

Under the directorship of Sister Margot, the guidance department will broaden its values clarification program to include community agencies. Career guidance materials will be increased and the department will serve as a resource center for community and alumni inquiries.

The English Department will study a plan which would change the sequence of courses in the department in order to correlate them with courses offered in other departments. The Science Club, directed by Ann Smith Gobe, will sponsor several lectures and field trips. and Sister Bernadine Freida, Science chairperson, will expand the tutorial program offered by the student members of the National Honor Society.

Beryl Tracey, a learning

disabilities specialist, will teach the academic methods course and assist the guidance department in implementing a competency testing program.

Several religious. educational, cultural and social events will dot the calendar in order to enhance the theme of DeSales for the coming school year — "Next to the Family: Desales".

St. John Fisher **Building Facilities**

"Colleges these days must meet the needs of students not only in academic areas but in facilities as well," declared Father Charles Lavery, president of St. John Fisher College in referring to the new Student Life Center which will open early in 1980. He went on to explain that Fisher needs the Center if it is going to maintain its excellence in all areas of student development. "Students need a place to relax and enjoy athletics and the Student Center will provide that for Fisher," he said.

The Center, which is being made possible by financial pledges from trustees, major corporations and individuals, will incorporate facilities for intercollegiate and intramural, sports, allowing Fisher to Not a select party — John offer expanded opportunites Keats for competition and

recreation. It will include a fieldhouse, a 150-meter track, main and practice basketball courts, capability for three tennis courts and four volleyball courts along with paddleball, handball, and racquetball courts, a squash court, wrestling and exercise rooms, sauna, student lounge and game room.

Fisher opens its doors this Fall with a full-time enrollment of 1,600 bringing total enrollment to more than 3,000.
