DPC Beginning Year

Waterloo — The Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) will begin its new year with a Mass celebrated by Bishop Matthew H. Clark in St. Mary's Church Saturday, Sept. 15 at 9 a.m.

The remainder of the agenda includes time for the DPC members to become acquainted with Bishop Clark, and for those items of business left uncompleted last November when Bishop Hogan resigned.

The last agenda item is an hour of open discussion, designed to give members the opportunity to share their concerns for the Church of the Rochester diocese with Bishop Clark.

In addition to the election of new officers, the council. will hear a report from the k Needs Task Force, which met during the summer.

Proposals pending last November to be discussed are: a proposal for a diocesan Youth Convocation, with youth representatives from throughout the diocese; a proposal calling for the diocesan directors to examine the study of the role filled by women in the diocesan Church, and develop plans to



Three More Priests Given New Posts

Father Robert Hammond, who has been active in programs for young people since his ordination in 1967, is the new chaplain of Notre Dame High School in Elmira.

Father Edward Palumbos, who has been Marriage Encounter coordinator for the past three years, has become associate pastor of An-Church, nunciation Rochester.

Father Kevin Murphy, who was co-pastor and then administrator of St. Patrick's Parish in Elmira, is now at St. Louis, Pittsford, as associate pastor.

These appointments are additions to a list of 28

published last week. All take effect formally today, the Pastoral Office announced.

Father Hammond developed Teen Seminar and follow-up programs while he was in parish work, and in 1970 became full-time director of this ministry.


