

Missions Helps 'David' Victims

Nearly half a ton of food and clothing donated by Rochester area people has been shipped to the Dominican Republic to aid the victims of Hurricane David; the diocesan missions office announced.

The effort which sent 38 large boxes to the stricken island was coordinated locally by Jose Tiburcio, 25, a native of the Dominican Republic and Father Joseph Reinhart, Diocesan Missions Director.

The shipment included some 800 pounds of clothing and 100 pounds of food. According to Tiburcio, the food sent was mostly canned fish and other items that could be eaten "right out of the can." He also stated that the shipment will be distributed first among "the poorest of the poor; Those who had very little before and now have probably nothing."

Tiburcio has spent the last several years in New York State, completing his education in Business Management at Utica College, and next month plans to return to his homeland. "I know I can do much more to help them there than by staying here," Tiburcio said.

Reinhart, the Missions Office has been issuing requests across the diocese to gather food and clothing for a second shipment that will be sent possibly the last week of this month.

"We appreciate the help that all involved have given us," Father Reinhart said, "And we hope to continue this through the joint efforts of the Spanish Apostolate and the Diocesan Missions Office."
